

“Welcome to the Joint Medical Programme”

The Faculty of Medicine, Srinakharinwirot University offers students direct admission to a Joint Medicine Programme (between the Faculty of Medicine, Srinakharinwirot University and the Faculty of Medicine, University of Nottingham, UK) since 2003. This programme provides a new alternative for students with a good science knowledge base and English skills from both Thai and international schools in Thailand as well as overseas in order to provide them with the opportunity to study preclinical subjects abroad and clinical subjects in Thailand. The students will study Biomedical Science at the University of Nottingham for 3 years and will be awarded the Bachelor Degree of Medical Sciences (B.Med.Sci.) from the University of Nottingham. After that, they will commence with their clinical studies at the Faculty of Medicine, Srinakharinwirot University. Upon completion of the clinical rotations, the students will be awarded the Doctor of Medicine degree (M.D.) from Srinakharinwirot University.

2. IELTS UKVI with a total score of no less than 7.0 and no less than 6.5 for each module

Tuition Fees

During Preparatory course, Year 4 to Year 6 at SWU, the fees will be charged as an International Course fees with the approximate rate of 400,000 Baht per year (rate may vary each year).

The fee charged by the University of Nottingham for Pre-clinical medicine is approximately £19,200 per year, for the first two years and 50% of this fee in the third year (rate may vary each year).

Programme of study >>>

A Preparatory Course will carry out at Srinakharinwirot University. All students must complete this course to the satisfaction of SWU BEFORE going to Nottingham in September. The main purposes of the course are to help students transfer from SWU to Nottingham, to complete the General Education studies and to have a chance to join first year activities with other medical students in the normal programme.

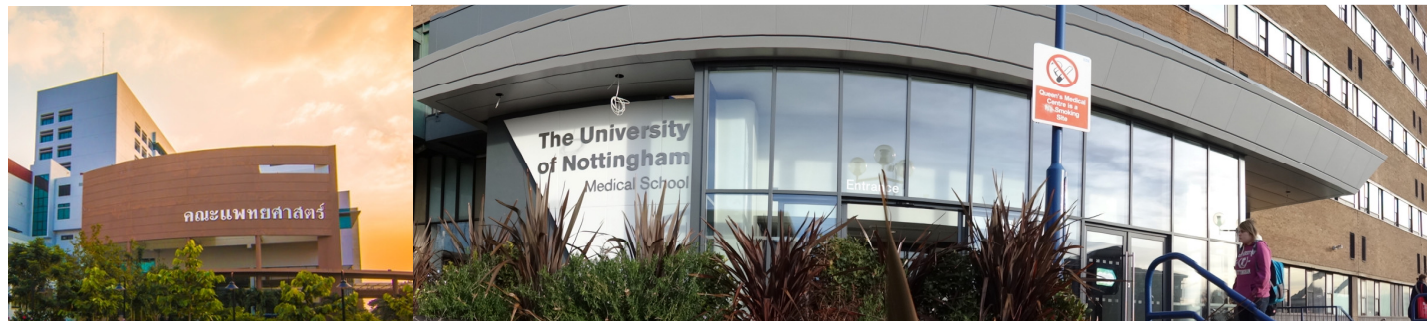
Year 1 - 3

Study Biomedical Sciences at Nottingham Complete B.Med.Sci. Receive a *Bachelor Degree of Medical Sciences, B.Med.Sci (Nottingham)*

Year 4 - 6

Study clinical courses at SWU Receive a *Doctor of Medicine degree, M.D. (SWU)*

The Joint Medical Course is fully integrated, and therefore, we are unable to allow exemptions from any parts of the course or from any examinations, even to students who already hold a related qualification, or have completed part of a medical course elsewhere. All students accepted to the course must take the full time study.

Written examination and Interview

The written examination composed of two parts: the basic sciences **and** the aptitude test. Those who past both parts of the written examinations will be invited to come for the interview.

2. To produce the knowledgeable medical graduates who can use the medical sciences knowledge from the UK and apply it to clinical practice in Thailand
